

Introduction

The MEUSE and the SCHELDT basins are located in the central part of Western Europe, between the Seine and Rhine basins



The MEUSE international hydrographic district

35.348 km2 8.8 M inhabitants (2006)

8 official partners participate in the international coordination of water management in the district :

- France
- Luxemburg
- Walloon Region
- Flemish Region
- Brussels Region
- Belgian feder. State
- Germany
- The Netherlands



The SCHELDT international hydrographic district

36.416 km2 12.8 M inhab (2006)

6 official partners participate in the international coordination of water management : France, Walloon Region, Flemish Region, Brussels Region,

Belgian feder. State, The Netherlands



LEGAL FRAMEWORK

- In 1994:
 - . the International Agreement on the Meuse
 - . the International Agreement on the Scheldt organise the international multilateral co-operation in the 2 basins
 - → Set up of the International Meuse Commission (IMC)
 - → Set up of the International Scheldt Commission (ISC)
- In 2002:
 - new Meuse and Scheldt Agreements in order to organize the int'l co-operation as regards the co-ordination imposed by the WFD in the European international districts notably: ONE single MANAGEMENT PLAN
 - → IMC and ISC = bodies where the WFD co-ordination takes place

OPERATIONAL FRAMEWORK

 In order to produce ONE single RBMP in the MEUSE Int'l district: decision is made in 2002:

THE RBMP of the district will be composed of:

- . an « UMBRELLA » part, elaborated jointly by all the partners:
 - i) main water management issues in the district
 - ii) efforts and results of the int'l co-ordination
- . the <u>national / regional management plans</u> elaborated by each of the partners in the district
- The same decision for the SCHELDT Int'l District
- Set up in the IMC and in the IMS of Expert Working Groups dedicated to the co-ordination of the technical aspects of the WFD

CO-ORDINATION ACTIONS

- Co-ordination of the Art.5 national / regional reports
 + an "umbrella" report on the characteristics of the district
- Co-ordination of the monitoring programmes
 + an "umbrella" report about the monitoring
- Co-ordination of the environmental objectives (surface water, groundwater)
- + special focus on transboundary rivers and aquifers
- Co-ordination of the national / regional Programmes of measures
 + special attention to the co-ordination of exemptions
- Set-up of technical tools:
 Web-GIS (→ maps), Transnational modelling (PEGASE)
- 2008: Draft of the "UMBRELLA" report of the RBMP

INVOLVMENT of the STAKEHOLDERS

- Participation of experts of NGOs in the technical W.Groups of the IMC / IMS
- Public consultation = a responsability of the Member States and NOT of International Commissions (=concertation bodies)
 - → public consultations are organized on a national / regional basis by the Water Authorities
- Public consultation on the DRAFT of the "Umbrella" report: organized by most of the Water Authorities (when the agendas made it possible)
 - + results taken into account in the elaboration of the final version of the "Umbrella" report
- Web-sites of IMC and IMS → links to the Web-sites of the Water Authorities (and vice-versa)

CONCLUSIONS

- Role of the different actors:
 - . National / Regional WFD Water Authorities
 - . International Commissions
 - . Stakeholders (NGOs), Public

is specific and well-defined since the beginning of the process

- Difficulties in the process of co-ordination and especially in the elaboration of the « Umbrella » report: mainly due to the different methods, agendas, internal procedures,... but: efforts towards transboundary harmonization and coherence
- The final versions of the « UMBRELLA » REPORTS of the RBMPs for the MEUSE and SCHELDT Int'l districts are expected to be approved in NOV / DEC 2009 (Plenary Assemblies of the Meuse and Scheldt Commissions)
