IWRM-NET

- is an European network composed of 17 partners coordinated by the International Office for Water
- is an ERA-NET project funded under the 6th FPC of the European Commission
- has started in January 2006 for 5 years









What does IWRM-NET aim to?

- Develop a trans-national network of research programme managers in the field of Integrated Water Resource Management
- Tackle challenges of Water Framework Directive implementation
- Implement new research programmes in the filed of water management to support policy making
- Share experiences in research management





What has been done up to now?

- Building up the IWRM-NET network open to new partnerships
- Development of IWRM-NET Knowledge Management Tool
- Preparation of the first IWRM-NET joint call
 - small scale meetings with researchers, policy-makers,
 practitioners, NGO to discuss research needs in the core of the
 WDF implementation







- International workshop held in London (January 2007) to highlight research issues
 - Edinburgh workshop (May 2007), two main topics selected:
 - Hydrological and morphological pressures and impacts on good ecological status
 - ° Water Governance







- 8&9 October 2007: Workshop in Vienna
 - final agreement on research issues
 - and principles/mechanism of the call
- Beginning of 2008: launch of the call
- June 2008: selection of research projects to be financed by IWRM-NET
- Beginning of the research for an approximate duration of 24 months
